


Join us at Platform this September to celebrate community projects from across Easterhouse and enjoy a showcase of performances and speakers from around the city and further afield.







### **GETTING TO PLATFORM**

**BY FOOT** A short walk from the Glasgow Fort shopping complex and situated next to Glasgow Kelvin College, Easterhouse Library and Swimming Pool (all part of The Bridge).

**BY BUS** It couldn't be easier with Stagecoach X19 and First Buses 38/A/B/C/E 41 43 46 60/60A/M60 stopping right outside the entrance on Westerhouse Road.

**BY TRAIN** From Queen Street take the lower level east bound to Easterhouse. From Edinburgh get the Helensburgh train on the Airdrie to Bathgate line. Platform is around a 15 minute walk from the station.

**DRIVING** Take M8 Junction 10. Entry is via Westerhouse Road – just look out for the wind turbine. There is a large free car park and there is further parking at Shandwick Square.

### **ACCESSIBILITY**

There is step free access to every level of The Bridge building. Box Office can be found at The Bridge reception desk which is of medium height and has a lower level section for wheelchair users.
